Our sports program includes various team sports like football, cricket, and athletics, as well as individual sports like swimming and gymnastics.







The Relax Kids in school specialist encourages pupils to use tools such as mindfulness and relaxation techniques to help pupils build emotional resilience, manage stress, and enhance their mental well-being. Such experiences are invaluable and contribute significantly to the overall development and education of young minds.









We want the best for every pupil and we can only achieve this when we all work together.


